FACEBOOK!

Facebook is a social utility that connects people with friends and others who work, study, and live around them. Users can join networks organized by city, workplace, school, and region to connect and interact with other people. People can also add friends and send them messages, and update their personal profiles to notify friends about themselves. If teachers or parents are not comfortable with their students working online with facebook, there is an attached handout that can be utilized instead.

1. Make a facebook page for Jane Edna Hunter. Research her. What did she look like? What is her facebook status? What is her contact information? Education? Birthday? Age?
2. Break into groups of four. Design a facebook page for someone around your age who lived on a plantation. Keep it during the time. Research their favorite books, music, and activities of a 12 -13 year old during that time. What would their status be? What kind of pictures would they post?
